Current Treatment and Future Directions

There are between an estimated 1.6 and 3.8 million sports-related concussions in the United States every year, leading The Center for Disease Control to conclude that sports concussions in the United States have reached an epidemic level.



Dr. Scott Burkhart will be presenting information on current techniques in the management and treatment of concussion injuries. Additional remarks will be made by Dr. Jacob VanLandingham on a promising drug treatment for concussion currently in the experimental stage at FSU College of Medicine Neuroscience. A question and answer session will follow the presentation.

Dr. Scott Burkhart earned his Doctorate in Clinical Neuropsychology from George Fox University in Newberg, Oregon. He is a Neuropsychology Fellow currently working for the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center Sports Concussion Program. He was recently hired by Tallahassee Orthopedic Clinic and will be opening a Concussion Program this fall. His current research interests include; validating risk factors for concussion and expediting the concussion recovery process.
